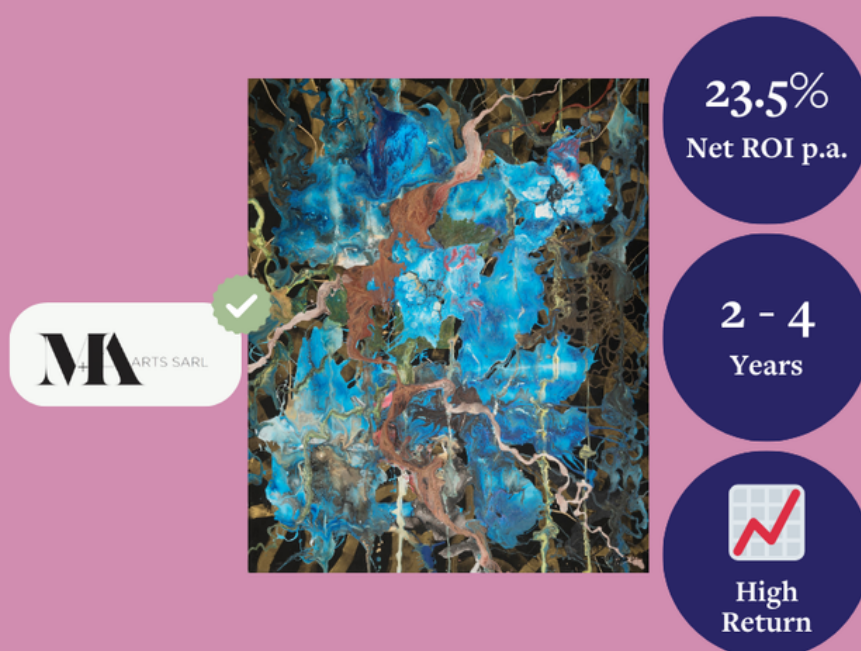


Britt Boutros-Ghali, Portfolio (4 Paintings), 2024

Over the past four years, the prices of Britt Boutros-Ghali's large-scale paintings have increased by an impressive 337.5%, yielding an annualized return of 44.6%.

Her prices have been bolstered by her association with TrafficArt, which has strategically been working towards aligning her prices with the international market and building her secondary

market by placing works at auctions. Recently, Britt joined Janet Rady Fine Art, an independent gallery with locations in London and Dubai, further solidifying her presence in the international market. Last year, the gallery successfully launched an online group show featuring her works.

Investment Case

Valuation Summary 📝 To ensure the competitiveness of the investment, we conducted a thorough verification of the purchase price by analyzing recent gallery transactions. Our analysis confirmed that the price offered, inclusive of all associated fees, is highly competitive. To estimate the potential ROI, we used the annualized return of his paintings over the past four years. For our conservative scenario, we assumed the value of the painting would grow at the rate of Swiss inflation, reflecting a defensive approach. In the balanced scenario, we assume a 60% probability of realizing a 44.6% (CAGR of the past 4 years) annual return for the next 4 years. Finally, in the ambitious scenario, we assume a 100% probability of realizing a 44.6% (CAGR of the past 4 years) annual return for the next 4 years.

An auction is considered if the price has developed to the point where the minimum bid matches the market value and there is high demand for works by the artist. Both options are carefully considered, and we will choose the one that maximizes the return for our investors.

Why Invest in This Asset? 💎 Britt Boutros-Ghali is one of Egypt's most celebrated contemporary artists and a world-class talent, following the tradition of abstract expressionist giants such as Helen Frankenthaler, Joan Mitchell, and Franz Kline. Britt was born in 1937 in Svolvær, in the Northern part of Norway, where the saturation of light in the summer was juxtaposed by the lack thereof in winter. She endured the harsh weather and daunting pressure of the Second World War. This emotional backdrop provided a

fertile landscape for her bursting, colorful, and emotional work.

Britt has spent the last five decades living and working in Egypt, where she is an integral part of the country's artistic community. Today, Britt divides her time between Cairo and Agami, maintaining studios in both locations. Her residence and studio in Agami, situated west of Alexandria along Egypt's northern coast, reflect her deep affection for the region. The artist compound is a living piece of art, infused with intricately crafted mosaics and murals. Local artists, collectors, and individuals with a penchant for the unique frequently gather at her home, while art enthusiasts from around the world make the journey to meet her and acquire her work.

In 1996, she received the prestigious St. Olav's Order, Norway's highest artistic honor, from King Haakon for her cultural and artistic contributions. Yet, it is perhaps her 2023 Lifetime Achievement Award for Women in the Arts from the Egyptian government that resonates most deeply. A testament to her indelible impact on the artistic landscape of her adopted homeland, it serves as a fitting tribute to a lifetime devoted to creativity and expression. Britt's work has garnered international acclaim. Since her debut exhibition in Paris in 1962, it has been exhibited worldwide, and her paintings are held in numerous private and public collections.
